Previous learning

Year 1

In Reception, children learnt what primary and secondary colours are as well as warm and cold colours. They learnt how to hold pencils with the correct tripod grip in order to draw. Children also created closed shapes with continuous lines and began to use these shapes to represent objects. Children learnt how to draw using some detail. For example, adding emotions such as a happy or sad face in their work.

Year 2

Children have learnt which primary colours mix together to make secondary colours. They know how to use a variety of drawing tools, such as pencils and crayons. Children also explored the use of line, shape and colour and can use different tones to create light and dark within their drawings. In Year 1, children learnt how to create patterns in their drawings.
